Take I-405 South to Hwy 169 Renton/Maple Valley. Follow Hwy 169 South to Enumclaw. Follow signs to Hwy 410 East. Turn left onto Hwy 410 East. Go about 6 miles and you will see a special right-hand turn lane. That is Mud Mountain Road. Turn right on Mud Mtn Rd. Go 2.5 miles to Mud Mountain Dam Project. The picnic shelter is the last one on the right.




