


The January meeting is our annual planning meeting. It will be held at our house in Kent on

WE HAVE GOT A PROBLEM

Chartered as a Non Profit Public Benefit Corporation, the Studebaker National Foundation has a problem and, hopefully, you can help solve it while benefiting yourself, a friend or a loved one. Primary among our three objectives is providing educational scholarships to qualified students seeking higher education in a field related to automobile preservation or restoration. Note that I said, "related to". Each scholarship application is reviewed on an individual basis by our liberal scholarship committee which determines if your field is related and makes a recommendation to the Board of Directors. A lot of weight is placed on the letter you write to the committee.

Most of us think of someone seeking a scholarship as being a young person entering college out of high school. The Studebaker National Foundation scholarship is offered to any qualified student, regardless of age or where they are on their educational journey. For instance, if a qualified high school senior wishes to enter an accredited college or university in the hope of learning about something automotive, he or she will likely qualify for a scholarship. On the other end of the spectrum, if someone is seeking a PhD in a related field and needs help financially, submitting an application for a Foundation scholarship is encouraged. It needs to be made clear here that the scholarship is currently fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for each semester, trimester or quarter and upon successful completion of each, the student is encouraged to reapply. Several have, to take them through to graduation.

While the student or the student's sponsor should be a member of the Studebaker Drivers Club, the Avanti Owners Association International or the Antique Studebaker Club when the scholarship is granted, the course of study nor the college or university need be Studebaker related.

All this being said, WE STILL HAVE GOT A PROBLEM. We simply are not receiving scholarship applications, although our treasury can accommodate them. I think one of the reasons is that the Advertising arm of the Studebaker National Foundation is not doing an adequate job of getting the word out. We have been in the business of helping people get through college for fourteen years and too few have been helped. I am reaching out to you through this newsletter to help us turn this around.

Found in a barn in Oklahoma, someone took it all apart as it was rust and dent free, and did a frame off restoration. My assessment is that the broken odometer was probably right, the car had 48,000 on it. That anyone would do a frame off on a Scotsman rather amazed me, but---- Anyway, something happened to the fellow who did it, it was 80% done, and his family sold it to a man in Texas. It had not been completely put back together, though a heater was found, it has turn signals, chrome bumpers, and a really nice purple and white interior. The exterior was also painted purple, the car looks surprisingly nice. The prep on the exterior paint was not good, and I kept it outside and inside and used the car for everything. The purple exterior is peeling, and will cover it a bit better, good prep work, then a repaint. And, NO trim to take off!!

It runs wonderfully, the 6 cyl flathead drips a bit (find one that doesn't), it has a never fail manual choke (love those), and the car is super dependable. Starts right now, every time. Currently has 14" tires and rims, but a set of 15" (rims only) can come with it if desired. Just installed new brakes, wheel and master cylinders, and it is ready to go. I put in a new gas tank when I got it, and it runs like a deer. Also, it needed gauges and a speedometer, borrowed them from my 57 parts car, I think they all work now,

and I have the 58 bezels to put in gauges that came in the car. It also has new glass all around, (excepting the front door wing windows) with all new seals. It does not leak a drop of water. I was going to use it as a great grocery getter, but have too many cars. It will be inexpensive, \$7500 covers my cost, I think, so let's call it that. Where else can you get a frame off restoration for that money? Finish to taste---

57 Studebaker Silver Hawk.

Never a dent, never any rust, the chrome and stainless all original and never restored---even the wheel covers and the exhaust tips are original on the car. Exterior was painted in 1995, all with correct colors and paint. The interior all original, radio worked until recently, it tries, but needs a diode or something. Heater is fine. Car was always stored in heated garage at a dealership, up to 1995. There is not even a crack in the steering wheel. The seats were repadded, over padded, really, and are super comfortable, and the last owner had custom covers made that look like Studebaker to the unpracticed eye. All running gear is original, 289 V8, Stick shift, overdrive--- I put in new valve guide seals, and a rebuilt Carburetor---all the motor needed.

My only change to the car was to put

in front disk brakes, so it has a dual system, and stops on a dime now, straight ahead. Done for safety, and no one knows the difference to look at it. The exterior and interior, and all chrome and stainless, are very nice and it shows well. All interior parts original except the seat covers. Odometer was not working, and last owner replaced it, with one with higher



miles. His estimate, and mine, is that the car has 90K on it, over 70K by the original owner, who used the car. The history of the car is compelling, it never was stored, always used a bit. I drive it often. In 2012, at the Can Am, had it judged, it gained 378 points out of 400. I have the judging sheet. The Hagerty insurance folks came out and checked this car over, it is valued in the book at \$38, 500, I put \$35.000 insurance on it, and we can talk about it. One other estimate of value came out at \$35,000 as well, done 4 years ago. You will never find a nicer nearly unrestored stock Silver Hawk. Bill McKivor 206-244-8345

Applied Technology: Tire Pressure Sensors

Some of the newer cars have been equipped with the tire pressure sensors for a number of years now. The sensors are in essence, a transmitter/pressure gauge that sends data to the car's computer. They are not cheap, priced at between \$75 and \$150 each. The projected life expectancy is 10 years of the built in battery life but some are known to have failed in as little as 4 years. The batteries cannot be taken out and replaced so the whole unit has to be replaced. As if this is not bad enough, some of the sensor units are made of aluminium and break easily as a person tries to remove them in order to add more air into the tire. They are not repairable so a new sensor needs to be installed. It can be presumed that many motorist will consider the sensors as a bit of frivolous equipment but nowadays, the cars that are equipped with them are considered to have them built in as part of the safety system and operating a vehicle with one sensor missing is considered as circumventing the safety sys-

tem. Not a good idea as viewed by law enforcement and the insurance underwriters. In the case of a motorist deciding to purchase a new set of wheels for the winter tires, he would need to purchase sensors for each of the tires. Apparently, a motorist did want to purchase a new set of tires and wheels for his car that was equipped with the sensors and did not want to purchase the sensors. The shop had the customer sign a liability waiver form. The car was later, involved in an accident and still, despite the motorist having signed the liability waiver, the court decided that the tire shop, operating as a business professional, should have known not to have equipped the wheels without the sensors and thereby circumventing the built in safety feature. It is said that the tire shop had to pay a hefty amount to satisfy the claim in court.

Life is much simpler with Studebakers. Lucky you!


