

### 1931 Studebaker Special Indy Car

From the Robert W. Valpey Collection

\$500,000 - \$750,000 SOLD \$1,105,000

Engine: P-5375

\*Please note that P-5375 is this vehicle's chassis number, not the engine number as stated in the catalogue; the engine number is 024.

The end result was a world record.

Earlier today during Monterey Car Week, a 1931 Studebaker Special Indy Car set yet a record, netting \$1,105,000 at auction. When it crossed the block at the Gooding & Company Pebble Beach Auctions, it was already poised to set the record as the most expensive Studebaker ever to be sold. Thanks to an intense bidding war, the price rose well over twice the low estimate, making for an exciting time.

As you might have already guessed, this is far from your ordinary <u>Studebaker</u>. The racer is significant to the history of the brand, having entered the Indy 500 three times. It also won the 1931 Pikes Peak Hill

Climb, setting a course record of 17 minutes, 10.3 seconds, which helped to elevate the Studebaker name.

Built by Ab Jenkins and George Hunt, this openwheel race <u>car</u> looks fantastic with a green coat of paint and white numbers. It uses a 336ci L-head inline 8-cylinder Studebaker engine with four Stromberg downdraft carburetors. Peak output is 205-horsepower at 4,200 rpm. The driver uses a 3-speed manual transmission and four-wheel mechanical drum brakes to control this car. Also included in the setup is an I-beam front axle with semi-elliptical leaf springs and shock absorbers. The rear live axle also features semi-elliptical leaf springs and shock absorbers.

There have only been five owners of this car, so many have been desiring to own the well-documented racer. It has been with its current owner since 1988. That factor was likely huge during the intense bidding war today.

Among those vying for this Studebaker Special Indy Car was the board of trustees for the Studebaker national Museum, which is based in South Bend, Indiana. They have been soliciting donations for the effort. Many consider this to car to be the most important Studebaker sold in the United States in the last half a century

# Time to continue on my '51 Restoration Project. We are still working on the Frame. (Actually the body was just reunited with the frame)

First order of business after separating the body from the frame was to refurbish the frame from the bottom up. As mentioned before, everything on the frame was dismantled and the frame sandblasted and painted. Going through the front end, most wearable items had to be replaced of . One exception is that I do not plan on rebuilding the steering gear, I just hope that will not come back and bite me. The front springs were replaced with new progressive springs. I believe they were made for for Chrysler rear springs. Very reasonable from O'Reiley.

New rear springs were made up from original Studebaker specs, manufactured in Canada. Not quite so reasonable. I had bought a set of disc brakes and dual master cylinder setup for Turner brakes at a meet some years ago. This was a good time to use them

But it turned out to be more than a simple replacement. The Master cylinder kit came with mounting



brackets which required several modification in order to fit. Also the master cylinder push link is now further away from the frame, and so requires an offset for the brake pedal rod. Parts were included to provide for this, but using those resulted in jamming the emergency brake linkage. So I ended up manufactur-



ing my own offset. Hope it will work OK.

Replacing all the old brake lines was also an interesting exercise with the addition of 3 more valves (two residual check valves and one proportioning valve). This time I elected to use copper-nickel line and it sure was a lot easier to work with than the old steel type both when it comes to bending as well as flaring. Of course I had a couple of leaks. Too insure that all leaks were eliminated, I depressed the brake pedal and held it in place with a bungie cord overnight. If the brake was still applied the next day and I could not see any leaks, I considered it good.




