

lines we have to wait to phase 4 before going out. And we are still in phase 1 or 2.




This is Mary's car taken shortly after she got it

The car was in Puyallup. The minute I saw that car, I fell in love. It was the coolest thing I had ever seen - black with white on the fins' insert and a red interior. It looked like the Bat-mobile, and I HAD to have it! I got to take it for a spin, which was fun and it had the Borg-Warner T-10 4 speed, which was great, as I prefer manual transmission. 
